# Activities: Daniel Boone Wilderness Trail Association, Roadside Theater Residency

## 2012

June 17–22 Wilderness Trail Summer Institute for Teachers

This week-long institute, a partnership among the Daniel Boone Wilderness Trail Association, Natural Tunnel State Park, and Mountain Empire Community College, involved planning with superintendants and other administrators from Scott, Lee, Wise, Dickenson, Washington, Russell counties and the City of Norton in Virginia as well as Sullivan County and Kingsport City Schools in Tennessee. The Institute was held at Natural Tunnel State Park in Scott Co., VA. Three college hours of teacher re-certification credit were awarded to eight (8) teacher/participants for creating SOL compliant lesson plans in their specific curriculum areas involving some aspect of the history of the Wilderness Trail.
